

Detective Robert Cline - EOW: Saturday, February 5th, 1938

Detective Cline was shot and killed in a fierce shootout between four bank robbers. Three of the robbers were shot and killed and several other officers were critically wounded. The fourth robber was shot in the spine and paralyzed. He was convicted of first-degree murder and sentenced to death. On April 6, 1938, he died on death row of complications from his wounds two weeks before his scheduled execution.

Detective Cline had been with the agency for 11 years.



Patrolman Jesse Reall - EOW: Saturday, February 26th, 1921

Patrolman Jesse Reall was shot and killed by a suspected bootlegger after intercepting a load of whisky at 6th Street and Naughten Street. The suspect shot him as he searched his car. The suspect was arrested a week later in Columbus.

The suspect was convicted of first-degree murder and sentenced to life. He was pardoned by Governor Davey on September 22nd, 1935.

Patrolman Reall had been with the agency for three years.



Patrolman David Luther Jenkins EOW: Saturday, February 8th, 1919

Patrolman David Jenkins was shot and killed while responding to a prowler call on the South Side. When he confronted the suspect, he was fatally wounded. He was able to return fire, fatally wounding the suspect as well.

Patrolman Jenkins had been with the agency for two years.
